Morris County is one of the ten wealthiest counties in the United States and has long been recognized as a prime setting for business and family. Morris County is located approximately 30 miles northwest of New York City, in the heart of northern New Jersey. Within 469 square miles of land area, the county contains 39 municipalities. The 13,000 acre county park system is noted statewide for its recreational facilities and preservation of Morris County's natural landscape. 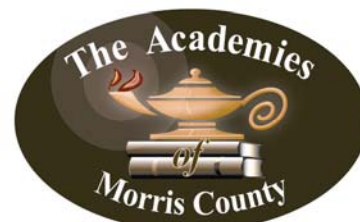
Full -Time Academies

Student Selection

Applicants for full time programs are selected from a diverse population of students throughout Morris County. Eighth grade applicants may apply for admission after September of that year. Standardized test scores, attendance, grade point average, an entrance examination and teacher recommendations are considered.

Shared-Time Special Needs Programs

Morris County School of Technology offers five special needs career training programs on a shared-time basis to high school students in cooperation with their high school. The programs include: Auto Body, Retail/Supermarket Careers, Food Services, Building Construction, and Building and Grounds Maintenance. Students earn twenty credits towards their high school diploma. Graduates enter the workforce as skilled employees or elect to continue their education at post secondary and technical institutions.

Graduation Requirements and Curriculum

A minimum of 160 credits are required for graduation in addition to passing the NJ High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA).

Grade Point Average

A cumulative grade point average (GPA) is maintained on all students beginning with the freshman year based on final grades in each course. A student's transcript contains class rank as well as his/her grade point average (GPA). In calculating GPA, the converted quality points are multiplied by the number of credits assigned to the course. The resultant course quality points are totaled and divided by the total credits attempted by the student.
