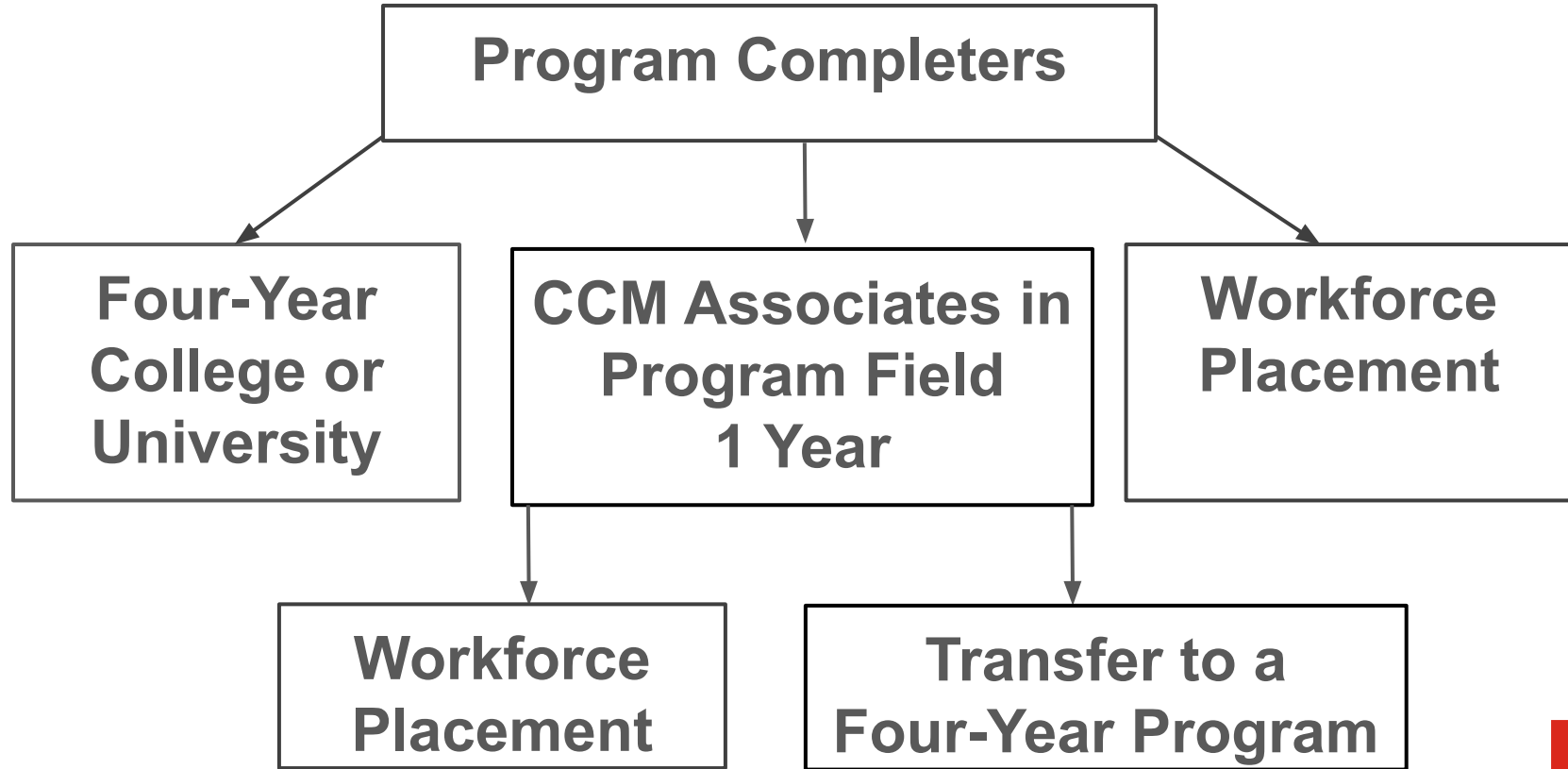

CCM Accessibility Services & Home District Responsibilities

- Students with IEP/504's will work with their year one professors on accommodations/modifications, as year one Professors are also MCVSD teachers.
- Students will also be registered with County College of Morris's Office of Accessibility Services for year two courses for accommodations/modifications, as the year two courses are not taught MCVSD teachers but by CCM professors.
- Students applying to the programs at CCM should be able to self advocate as the programs are college level courses.
- Sending District will provide MCVSD with the applicants most recent IEP/504 and supporting Educational & Psychological evaluations for the Accessibility services application.

NJ High School Graduation Requirements

- Each year the program courses fulfill 20 credits of the CTE requirement for high school graduation.
- MCVSD will offer and transcribe 2.5 credits for the successful completion of the online course MoneySkill, and will issue a grade of *Pass/Fail* to fulfill the Personal Finance Literacy graduation requirement, if needed.
- Individual school districts will vary on how grades will be weighted during grade transcription.



Calendars, Attendance & Orientation

- Year 1 students: Follow MCVSD's School Calendar and [Attendance Policy](#)
- Year 2 students: Follow CCM's academic calendar and attendance policy per Professors Syllabus
- There will be a mandatory Welcome Reception for all accepted applicants will occur in June. Information and dates will be provided after acceptance.
- There will be a mandatory Orientation for all accepted applicants in August. Information and dates will be provided in July.



Transportation / After School Clubs / Athletics in Home Districts

- Transportation is provided and arranged by your home district to and from the program.
 - We are your transportation “*Advocate*”
- Students need to determine if they can properly manage after school activities and the programs.
- We support after school activities but students must be able to stay on top of their assignments and studying
- CCM allows 17 year old to drive to campus, Home District must be in line. A parking permit will need to be obtained.



Option II

Earn an Associate of Applied Science Degree from CCM while enrolled with one of MCVSD's Satellite Share-Time Programs

Terminate with a HS Diploma and an AAS Degree from CCM

- Requires:
 - Rigorous, year-round coursework
 - Home-district approval for Dual Credit enrollment
 - Academic clearance through CCM's Challenger Program placement metrics



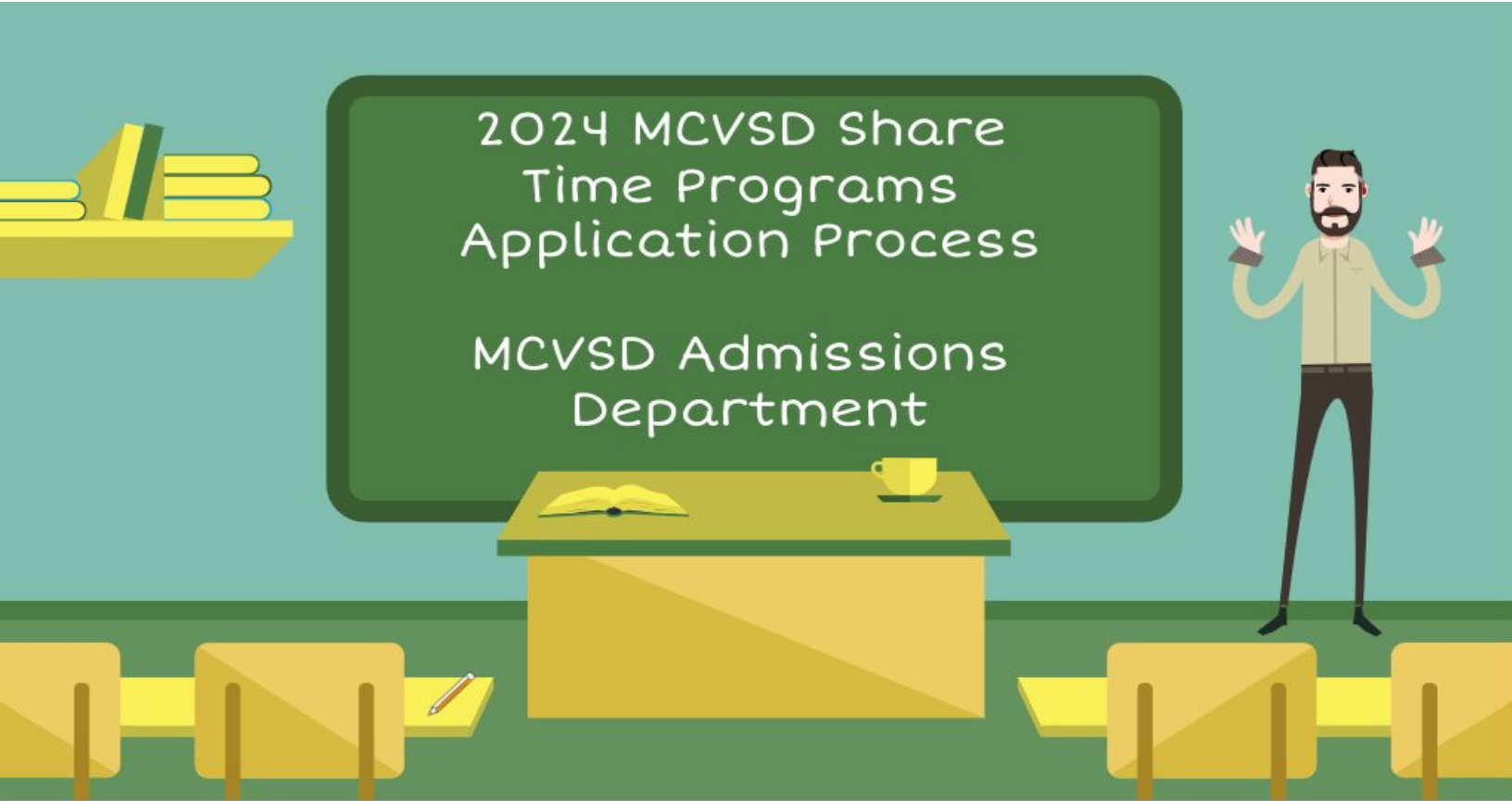
Who Should Apply

Admissions

- Application is available online at MCVTS.org/apply
- The [Share-Time Admissions Handbook](#) is available on our website.
- Admissions criteria includes:
 - GPA
 - Attendance
 - Conduct Records
 - Teacher Recommendation
- The application is open 1/2/2024 - 4/1/2024



Admissions (continued)

- Students/Parents will initiate the process via the online application.
- Email notice will be sent to the applicant's School Counselor. The student will give their School Counselor a signed release form.
 - Your school can not proceed/release documents without the release form.
- School Counselors input the required data in an online portal (via an email that they receive once the applicant submits their application).



Admissions (continued)

- Applicants will be informed via email of acceptance, non-acceptance or waitlist status (mid-May).
- We greatly encourage early applications.
- Help to ensure your file is complete by following up with your School Counselor.
