

Summer Credit Recovery Program Description:

In order to ensure that our students remain in good academic standing for the 2021-2022 school year, we are pleased to offer an in-person credit recovery program on our Denville campus this summer. The program is intended for students to recover credit loss due to failure or attendance issues. The program is grant-funded and provided at no cost to our families. Please read each course description carefully and work with your guidance counselor to register for the correct course(s). Courses are open to all full-time Morris County Vocational School District students, including students who attend our satellite programs. Seats will be filled on a “first-come, first-served” basis. **Applications are due by June 30, 2021.**

- The Summer Credit Recovery Program will take place in air-conditioned classrooms from 8 am to 1 pm..
- NJDOE mandated Covid-19 procedures and protocols will be followed.
- Students may bring their own lunch. Accommodations to refrigerate and microwave snacks/meals are available. Mascio’s Food Services, Inc. will also provide lunch at no cost to students.
- Regular attendance is required in order for credit to be granted.

Code of Conduct: Our current code of conduct will be enforced. Violators may be removed from the program immediately and/or may jeopardize their return to school in the fall.

- Drugs, alcohol, and smoking are **not** permitted in buildings or on school grounds.
- Fighting; Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying (HIB) will not be tolerated.
- Students must abide by the District’s Acceptable Use Policy for all computers and electronic devices.
- Students are encouraged to wear comfortable but appropriate clothing and footwear. Our current dress code will be followed.
- Cell phones and other electronic devices must be turned off before entering the building. Students may not use electronic devices in the classroom without the permission of the teacher. Any student found to be using an unauthorized electronic device will have it confiscated, and a parent/guardian must come to the school to retrieve it.
- Infractions not covered above will be handled at the discretion of the Administration in accordance with district board policies.
